## Friday 30 October 2020

Good morning everyone

Together with Bishop Michael, I was delighted to officiate at the Blessing and Opening of St Joseph's Catholic Kindergarten in Bundaberg on Wednesday. St Joseph's Kindy is the first Catholic kindergarten to open in Bundaberg and, significantly, adjoins the city's first Catholic primary school, St Joseph's Catholic Primary School, which opened 140 years ago.
