#### Friday 13 November 2020

Good morning everyone

This week was recognised nationally as NAIDOC Week celebrating the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples under this year's theme *Always Was, Always Will Be.* Although we held our NAIDOC Masses in Term 3, it is important during this delayed official celebration of NAIDOC week that we recognise that First Nations people have occupied and cared for this continent for over 65,000 years and are spiritually and culturally connected to this country.

Remembrance Day was also commemorated on Wednesday this week — a time when we call to mind and honour the memory of those who died or suffered in all wars or armed conflicts. I thank you all for continuing to observe the time-honoured tradition of one minute's silence to reflect on the sacrifice of so many for the freedoms we enjoy today. *Lest we forget*.

Today, as the Diocesan Education Council (DEC) meets for the final time for 2020, we farewell Jim Hanley who has been a Council member for the past 6 years.
